## HEALTH AND SAFETY IN THE NHS: RIDDOR

- 1. Since the Reporting of Inquiries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 1985 (SI 1985 No 2023) came into operation on 1 April 1986, several leaflets containing guidance on the Regulations have been issued by the Health and Safety Executive from time to time. Two copies of the latest version of the leaflet, which is recommended to NHS employment authorities by the NHS Management Executive, are attached for information.
- 2. The Regulations apply chiefly to events (deaths or injuries resulting from accidents, instances of disease and dangerous occurrences) which arise out of or in connection with work activities governed by the Health and Safety at Work Etc Act 1974.
- 3. The main purpose of the Regulations is to generate reports to the Health and Safety Executive and to Local Authorities ("the enforcing authorities" referred to in the leaflet) which will help them to perform their various accident and ill-health prevention activities effectively and efficiently, by indicating when and how problems arise and by identifying trends.
- 4. The guidance in the latest version of the leaflet continues to support accident prevention strategies through the maintenance of an accident and incident recording system which will help towards achieving a more realistic analysis of accident patterns within the NHS.
