HOSPITAL MEDICAL AND DENTAL STAFF: LOCUM TENENS ENGAGED THROUGH PRIVATE AGENCIES

1. The maximum authorised payments which Health Boards and Trusts may make for private agency locums are removed from 1 April 1994.

 - thereafter negotiate charges with individual agencies relevant to local circumstances;

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ANNEX

LOCUM TENENS ENGAGED THROUGH PRIVATE AGENCIES

1. NHS MEL(1993)60 set out the ceilings for payments to locum agencies effective from 1 April 1993.

2. The Government has decided that these ceilings will be removed from 1 April 1994. This change is in line with the Government's policy of deregulation and delegation of decision-making to local level and will allow employing authorities to negotiate charges with individual locum agencies which are relevant to their local circumstances.

3. The aim should be to reduce overall expenditure on locums rather than increase costs. Employing authorities are therefore encouraged to improve planning and devise innovative cost effective methods of providing cover for prospective vacancies.

4. It remains essential that employing authorities satisfy themselves that all locums whom they wish to appoint have the qualifications and experience necessary to provide the cover required.
