NURSE PRESCRIBING IN ENGLAND: CROSS BORDER DISPENSING ARRANGEMENTS

Purpose

The purpose of this letter is to inform community pharmacists and appliance suppliers of the arrangements for dispensing prescriptions in Scotland arising from nurse prescribing demonstration sites in England.

Background

Nurse prescribing is to be introduced from 3 October at eight community demonstration sites for the purpose of developing and testing the management and financial arrangements of nurse prescribing. Any prescriptions arising from these demonstration sites in England and being presented for dispensing in Scotland should be dispensed in the normal way and forwarded to PPD for reimbursement.



NURSE PRESCRIBING: DISPENSING ARRANGEMENTS

The purpose of this Memorandum is to advise chemist contractors and appliance suppliers about dispensing any prescriptions emanating from the nurse prescribing demonstration sites in England which may be presented to them by NHS patients.

Background

With effect from 3 October 1994, nurse prescribing will be introduced at eight community demonstration sites in England to develop and test the management and financial arrangements of nurse prescribing. From that date prescriptions from any of the English demonstration sites presented in Scotland will need to be dispensed under the normal NHS arrangements.

Nurse Prescribers

Nurse prescriber means a nurse or health visitor who is qualified to order listed drugs and medicines and listed appliances on a NHS prescription form. Nurse prescribers are first level nurses on the professional register who have a registered health visiting qualification or a recorded district nurse qualification and who have successfully completed nurse prescribing training of a standard considered sufficient by the United Kingdom Central Council (for Nursing, Midwifery and Health Visiting), the UKCC.

Preparations which nurses may prescribe under the Drug Tariff

Medicinal preparations - see Annex A

Appliances and Reagents (including Wound Management Products) - see Annex B

Prescription Forms FP10(CN) and FP10(PN)

The prescription forms are identical to the normal FP10 used in England, except for their colour. For practice nurses the form is an FP10(PN) and is LILAC. For health visitors and district nurses employed by a community unit or trust it is a FP10(CN) and is GREEN.

Action by Dispensers

The usual arrangement to the dispensing of prescription forms will apply. Nurse prescriptions dispensed by chemist contractors or appliance suppliers should be collated separate from the normal GP10s, and forwarded with them to PPD who will arrange re-embursement. Any query arising from the prescription should be referred to the practice. The telephone number is shown on the prescription form with the prescriber's name and practice address.
