ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE DISTINCTION AWARDS AND DISCRETIONARY POINTS SCHEMES FOR CONSULTANTS

Summary

1. This letter confirms the arrangements for the distinction awards and discretionary points schemes during 2023-24.

Arrangements for 2023-24

Payment of Discretionary Points

- 2. The current arrangements for discretionary points will continue and these should be paid in 2023-24 for work done during 2022-23
- 3. Boards are asked to arrange for the necessary processes to be put in place to enable discretionary points to be paid to eligible consultants for work done in 2022-23.
- 4. Boards should note that arrangements for the payment of discretionary points should continue to be put in place annually until advised otherwise.

Distinction Awards

5. The current arrangements for distinction awards will remain in place. Distinction awards will therefore continue to be frozen with no increase in the value of awards, no new awards and no progression through the award scheme during 2023-24.

Five-yearly review of Distinction Awards

6. The Scottish Advisory Committee on Distinction Awards (SACDA) has completed the five-yearly review of awards as normal and the Twenty-third SACDA Annual Report has been published, and can be seen HERE
