Medicine Supply Alert Notice

Colestid® (colestipol) orange and plain 5g granules sachets

Priority: Level 2*

Valid until: end of May 2021

Issue

- 1. Colestid® Orange sachets are out of stock until the end of May 2021.
- 2. Colestid® Plain sachets are out of stock with a resupply date to be confirmed.
- 3. Other bile-acid sequestrants remain available.
- 4. Supplies of unlicensed imports of colestipol sachets have been sourced.

Advice and Actions

- 5. For patients with insufficient supplies, clinicians should consider:
 - prescribing an alternative bile-acid sequestrant (see UKMi memo for further information); or
 - prescribing unlicensed colestipol sachets if alternative medicines are not appropriate.
 Prescribers should work with pharmacy teams to ensure orders are placed within appropriate time frames as lead times may vary (see additional information below).
