Medicine Supply Alert Notice

Salbutamol 2.5mg/2.5ml and 5mg/2.5ml nebuliser liquid unit dose vials

Priority: Level 3* Valid until: TBC

Issue

- 1. Salbutamol 2.5mg/2.5ml and 5mg/2.5ml nebuliser liquid is in very limited supply with a resolution date to be confirmed.
- 2. Unlicensed supplies of salbutamol 2.5mg/2.5ml and 5mg/2.5ml nebuliser liquid have been sourced, lead times vary.
- 3. Alternative beta₂-agonists for nebulisation remain available, however, they cannot support an increase in demand.
- Additional guidance to Health Boards and healthcare professionals has been issued via an National Patient Safety Alert (NatPSA/2024/003/DHSC_MVA).

Advice and Actions

- 5. Primary and secondary care should:
 - place urgent orders now for unlicensed imports of salbutamol 2.5mg/2.5ml and 5mg/2.5ml nebuliser liquid (see additional information below). Due to lead times, do not wait for licensed supplies to be exhausted before placing orders for imports. Prescribers should work with local pharmacy teams to ensure orders are placed within appropriate time frames as lead times may vary; and
 - note and complete the actions outlined in the National Patient Safety Alert.

Additional Information

Clinical information

- 6. Salbutamol is a selective beta₂-agonist providing short-acting (4-6 hour) bronchodilation with a fast onset (within 5 minutes) in reversible airways obstruction. The nebuliser liquids are licensed for use in the management of chronic bronchospasm unresponsive to conventional therapy, and in the treatment of acute severe asthma.
- 7. <u>BTS/SIGN guidance</u> recommends that in patients with mild to moderate asthma attacks, beta2-agonists can be administered by repeated activations of a pressurised metered dose inhaler via an appropriate large volume spacer. In acute-severe or life-threatening asthma, beta2-agonists should be administered by nebulisation.

Please be aware that while medicines supply issues will appear on the SPS website, some of the recommended actions may not always be appropriate / relevant within the Scottish context.
