## **Medicine Supply Alert Notice**

## Co-trimoxazole 40mg/200mg/5ml oral suspension sugar free

Priority: Level 2\*

Valid until: early September 2024

#### Issue

- 1. Co-trimoxazole 40mg/200mg/5ml oral suspension sugar free is out of stock until early September 2024.
- 2. Co-trimoxazole 80mg/400mg/5ml oral suspension remains available and can support increased demand.
- 3. Unlicensed imports of co-trimoxazole 40mg/200mg/5ml oral suspension sugar free can be sourced, lead times vary.

#### **Advice and Actions**

- 4. All prescribers should:
  - consider prescribing co-trimoxazole 80mg/400mg/5ml oral suspension, the excipients differ from those of co-trimoxazole 40mg/200mg/5ml oral suspension, therefore before switching ensure that the person is not intolerant to any of the excipients, and is counselled on the appropriate dose and volume required (see Additional information);
  - consider prescribing unlicensed products only where licensed alternatives are not appropriate. Prescribers should work with local pharmacy teams to ensure orders are placed within appropriate time frames as lead times may vary (see Supporting information); and
  - if the above options are not considered appropriate, advice should be sought from specialists on management options.

### **Clinical Information**

- 5. Co-trimoxazole **40mg/200mg/5ml** oral suspension sugar free is licensed for use in children aged 12 years and under (infants [>6 weeks to <2 years old] and children [>2 to <12 years old]).
- 6. Co-trimoxazole **80mg/400mg/5ml** oral suspension is licensed for use in children aged >12 to <18 years and adults.
- 7. Co-trimoxazole 80mg/400mg/5ml oral suspension contains different excipients to co-trimoxazole 40mg/200mg/5ml oral suspension sugar free and may not be as palatable for some

children. Children with rare hereditary problems of fructose intolerance, glucose-galactose malabsorption or sucrose-isomaltase insufficiency should not take this medicine. However, in other children, it may be considered for off-label use, once it is confirmed that the child is not intolerant to any of the excipients, and the patient/carer is counselled on the appropriate dose and volume required.

8. NOTE: 5ml of co-trimoxazole 40mg/200mg suspension = 2.5ml of co-trimoxazole 80mg/400mg suspension.

- 10. Any decision to prescribe an unlicensed medicine must consider the relevant guidance and Health Board or local governance procedures. Unlicensed imports do not undergo any central quality assessment or suitability evaluation. Therefore, any import must be locally assessed in line with local unlicensed medicines processes.

- 13. We encourage prescribers, pharmacy professionals, and pharmacy procurement leads in Scotland to register with the SPS website and use its Medicine Supply Tool to stay up to date concerning medicines supply disruptions. Please be aware that while medicines supply issues

will appear on the SPS website, some of the recommended actions may not always be appropriate / relevant within the Scottish context.
