## Medicine Supply Alert Notice

## Cefalexin 500mg tablets

# Priority: Level 2<sup>\*</sup> Valid until: late September 2024

#### Issue

- 1. Cefalexin 500mg tablets are out of stock until late-September 2024.
- 2. Cefalexin 500mg capsules remain available and can support an uplift in demand.
- 3. Alternative cefalexin preparations remain available but are unable to support an uplift in demand.
- A Serious Shortage Protocol (SSP) for cefalexin 500mg tablets was issued on 06/08/2024 (ref SSP 072). See <u>PCA(P)(2024)22</u> for further information.

#### Advice and Actions

- 5. Community pharmacists and dispensing doctors should:
  - where a prescription for cefalexin 500mg tablets is presented and cannot be fulfilled, cefalexin 500mg capsules should be supplied in accordance with SSP 072;
  - ensure the cautions and exclusion criteria are taken into account when considering using an SSP; and
  - ensure patients/parents/carers are counselled regarding the switch in formulation, and acceptability of gelatin in the capsules.
- 6. If the patient is deemed ineligible or does not consent to receive the capsule formulation via the SSP, they should be promptly referred back to the prescriber.
- 7. Prescribers should:
  - not initiate new patients on cefalexin 500mg tablets until the supply issue has resolved;
  - consider prescribing cefalexin 500mg capsules, if suitable, checking patient acceptability of gelatin content of capsules; and
  - if cefalexin capsules are unsuitable, consider prescribing an alternative antibiotic, taking into account allergies and local and national guidance on antimicrobial prescribing.

Cefalexin is a 'first generation' cephalosporin licensed for the treatment of the following infections due to susceptible micro-organisms: respiratory tract infections, otitis media, skin and soft tissue infections, bone and joint infections, genito-urinary infections, including acute prostatitis, and dental infections.
