Medicine Supply Alert Notice

Coal tar extract (Neutrogena® T/Gel® Therapeutic) 2% shampoo

Priority: Level 2*

Valid until: product is being discontinued from February 2025.

Issue

- 1. Coal tar extract (Neutrogena® T/Gel® Therapeutic) 2% shampoo (all pack sizes) is being discontinued from February 2025.
- 2. Alternative coal tar extract preparations remain available and are able to support an increase in demand.

Advice and Actions

- 3. Clinicians should:
 - not initiate any new patients on Neutrogena® T/Gel® therapeutic shampoo;
 - consider prescribing an alternative coal tar extract preparation, ensuring that the patient is not intolerant to any of the excipients (see Additional information); or
 - if the above options are not considered appropriate, advice should be sought from specialists on management options.
