## **Medicine Supply Alert Notice**

# Dalivit® Oral Drops

Priority: Level 2\*

Valid until: TBC - Please refer to medicines supply tool on the Specialist Pharmacy Service (SPS) website for updates on the anticipated resupply date (registration required)

#### Issue

- 1. Dalivit® Oral Drops are out of stock until further notice.
- 2. Abidec® Multivitamin Drops remain available and can support increased demand.

#### **Advice and Actions**

- 3. Clinicians should:
  - review existing patients to determine if Dalivit<sup>®</sup> Oral Drops are still required;
  - consider prescribing Abidec<sup>®</sup> Multivitamin Drops for young children where appropriate, ensuring that they are not intolerant to any of the excipients, including arachis oil (peanut oil), which should not be taken by patients with peanut or soya allergy, and counsel parent(s)/carers on the appropriate dose and volume required; and
  - if Abidec® drops are not suitable, refer to <a href="NPPG table">NPPG table</a> or local formulary to guide selection of an alternative liquid supplement for use in the paediatric population.

#### Clinical Information

4. Dalivit<sup>®</sup> Oral Drops and Abidec<sup>®</sup> Multivitamin Drops are indicated for the prevention of vitamin deficiencies and for the maintenance of normal growth and health during the early years of infancy and childhood.
