The final paragraph on page 301 under the heading CS 1.1 Practice guidance reads as "From April 2011, the exception reporting rules regarding 'did not attend' (DNA) letters for the additional services cervical screening indicators in the QOF have changed. The first two letters from the central cancer screening services inviting a patient to attend for a screening will now count towards the three letters required to code a patient as DNA."
- In Scotland however all three letters are sent out centrally by the Scottish Cervical Call Recall System (SCCRS)
